She began her career in Mitchell County in 1957-59 and later transferred to Gaines County where she served the residents from 1959-1986. Elinor trained 9 assistant home economic agents, more than any trainer agent in Texas. The assistant's primary responsibility was training and programming for 4-H adult leaders and 4-H members for 2 years before moving on to other Counties. At one time, all 9 assistant agents continued to be employed by the Texas Extension Service. Elinor had a tremendous influence on everyone she taught, both youth and adults, in the county as well as her co-workers. She served with her head, heart, hands, and health for the better lives of others. She made the Best Better. If Elinor didn't know how to do something, she taught herself and then taught others; including training the 4-H horse judging team that won state. She didn't know the first thing about the horse program, but the 4-Hers needed a horse leader, she got a book and the rest is history. Elinor loved seeing the growth of 4-H members and witnessing other's accomplishments. She didn't have boundaries of who she might serve or influence. She was respected by the agricultural agents in the county too, as well as others across the state. Elinor trained agents in Gaines county who went on to become a 4-H specialist, District Directors, statewide Specialist and the Texas Extension Director.

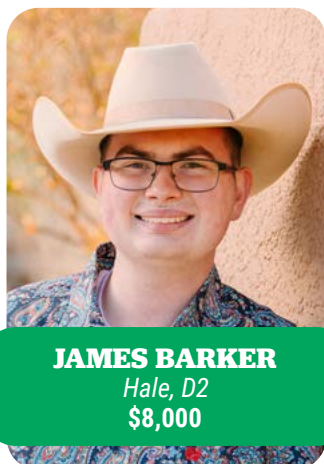
Fort Worth Stock Show and Rodeo
